Dear Parents / Caregivers

Parking in the Community

We are receiving an increased number of calls and complaints from neighbouring residents regarding Lowbrook parents parking in and around Bedford Drive, Loosen Drive, The Fairway and Fairlea. It has come to our attention that some parents are consistently parking inconsiderately, obstructing the private driveways of residents, being abusive to residents, parking cars over white lines and parking so far over the pavement that it forces parents walking with their children to walk in the road. Due to these complaints a petition has been signed by the residents to enforce residents parking in these areas if this situation does don't get rectified immediately. I cannot emphasise enough that swearing and being non-compliant to members of our community is not an acceptable practice from parents of this school.

We have reiterated before that the health and safety of the school children is our first priority and whilst we have no parking on site, we ask that you park considerately and with respect to our neighbouring community within which the majority of Lowbrook families reside. Furthermore, should Lowbrook School, the nursery or the residents ever need emergency medical assistance during drop off and pick up time current parking situation would make it impossible for emergency vehicles to access the school.

The petition is from 51 neighbours of Bedford and Loosen Drive that reads:

"We the undersigned (of respective roads) wish our road to be resident only parking between 8.00 a.m. **to** 9.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. weekdays due to the volume of traffic and inconsiderate parking of LAN parents taking and collecting their children from Lowbrook Academy."

We actively encourage walking, cycling or scooting to school and we have a dedicated area to lock up (burnes bikes and scooters during the day and a path with a zebra crossing for safe access to the school. We are aware that some parents / caregivers have no choice but to drive to school but we would like to reiterate the importance of respectful and considerate parking within our community.
